- Adaptive management
 - Process
 - Monitoring
 - Management of Conflict
- Management of natural and built assets
- Integrated land use and watershed management
 - Conserve, recycle, reuse
 - watershed management
 - Being proactive when developing our communities
 - Adaptation should be 2nd nature

Built Environment Walker Wells

- Every project/plan should integrate adaptation in whatever way is effective and appropriate
 - Adaptation should be a design component
 - Power of design
- Create localized, distributed networks for energy, water, & food
 - As opposed to the current set up
- Partnerships
 - Need to communicate urgency and potential for co-benefits
 - Need to have community outreach and involvement (grassroots) in a language that can be received
 - More regional coordination and accountability



Energy

- New normal is change and pace is largely determined by mitigation
- Adaptation must provide real value over three timescale – near, mid, and long term
- Three areas
 - Generate, deliver, and use clean energy
 - Create integrated systems, with regards to technology and how people behave
 - Develop effective partnerships

Public Health

- Public health has been missing in the field of climate change, esp wrt adaptation strategies
 - Need to increase communication and data centers
- Need to ensure people can safely be outside and more active through modifications of built environment.
- Health needs to be the underlying goal



Biodiversity

Andy Lipkis

- Protect open space and biodiversity within the city and adjacent (upstream and downstream impacts) area
- Create a unified climate adaptation friendly ethic to drive the work
 - Would be a game changer
 - As a design ethic in all we do
- Integration, multi-benefit ecosystem-based thinking
 - Create viable adaptive designs (instead of single purpose)
 - Financial viability through bringing in multiple funders/sectors
 - Translate our language / practices across the silos;
 - Add feedback, listening to the public
 - Take this to scale – move from prototype to prime time; move more quickly



Governance

Paul Bunje

- Governance is a tool, the mechanism by which we adapt (should be recognized)
- Full integration into local community interest, operation, planning, regulation
 - Needs to be mandated
 - Political will
 - Leadership (business, community, political)
 - Integration/inclusion of diverse and vested interests
 - Community engagement, education, communication
 - Guidance, tools, instruments of support
 - Specific indicators, local appropriateness
- Local governments must be required to consider adaptation in all decisions
 - Propose a state mandate
